Congratulations! You have been selected by your peers as a Scout who exemplifies the Scout Oath and Law in your everyday life. You are now eligible to become a member of the Order of the Arrow, Scouting's National Honor Society. Your next step is to complete an Ordeal, which is a series of trials that will test you mentally and physically. These tasks are challenging but within your capabilities. Do not be fooled by the words of your peers, the induction weekend is a memorable experience that you will reflect upon for the rest of your life. Your next step is to undergo your Ordeal, which you can complete at one of our upcoming Ordeal weekends. We host Ordeal weekends at Kiondaga Lodge's Fellowships in the spring and fall. You must complete your Ordeal by the end of this year, or you will have to be elected by your peers again. Our next Spring Fellowship is May 14-16, and our next Fall Fellowship is September 10-12.

The Ordeal is a test of your sincere dedication to the Order and its principles. It is a trial in which you will sleep under the stars, perform cheerful service, eat scant food, and keep a strict vow of silence. Our Ordeals are held at Old Ben Scout Reservation, and check-in will be at 6:00 PM (CT). The weekend will conclude on Sunday morning after a short meeting. You will need to bring basic camping equipment to use Saturday night after the completion of your Ordeal. You should bring some spending money to use in the trading post after your Ordeal Saturday night and Sunday morning. A checklist for your Ordeal is on the other side of this letter.

Registration is online at <u>kiondaga.org</u>. The fee includes an OA sash, lodge flap, OA Handbook, food for the weekend, and your membership dues up to December 31. After your Ordeal, we encourage you to come back to our other fellowships, Winter Banquet, and service days at Old Ben Scout Reservation and to seal your membership in the OA through the completion of your Brotherhood.
